<b>Details</b>	<p>Back on Track provide education for adults who have experienced a period of disruption in their lives due to substance misuse, involvement in the criminal justice system, homelessness or mental illness so they can progress to mainstream education, volunteering or paid work. They run courses at their education centre in Swan Buildings, Swan Street, or in hostels, day centres, and Probation offices. Courses include basic skills such as literacy and numeracy, computers, art, as well as life skills such as cookery and personal finance.</p> <p>Back on Track also offer mentoring and advice and guidance sessions for people wishing to discuss their options around education, training or voluntary or paid work. Much of their work is supported by volunteers who add unique value to Back on Track: ordinary people who give up their time to support our service-users. They have a variety of volunteer opportunities available and training is provided.</p> <p>Volunteer roles include Activity Leaders, Outdoor Activity Leader, Reception and Administration and Volunteer Mentors.</p>
